






## Eskişehir




A CITY that combines history, beauty, culture, and art.









The cities of Bilecik, Bolu, Ankara, Konya, Afyon, and Kütahya border it.

Since the history of Eskişehir dates back to 3000 BC, the city was literally named "Old City."

Population: 888,828, surface area: 13,652 km², province traffic code: 26.

Eskişehir has become the Cultural and Art Capital of Anatolia with its theaters, opera houses, and museums. Eskişehir has 29 museums, 11 public libraries, and 3 university libraries.

Eskişehir is 11°C. According to monthly averages, the coldest month of the year is January, with an average temperature of -2°C. Winters are snowy; summers are hot and dry. However, it receives light summer rain from the Black Sea region.

Rainfall in October and sleet in November indicate the beginning of winter.

Public transportation in Eskişehir is mainly provided by tram, bus, minibus, and shared taxi (dolmus).

Except for dolmuş, other public transportation vehicles can be accessed using electronic cards called "EsKart" or credit cards. Dolmuş fees are paid in cash. "EsKart" has two options: student (reduced) and regular costs. Additionally, there are electric scooter rental points called "Martı," "Binbin," and "Hop" throughout the city for those who do not want to use public transportation. These scooters can be used at affordable rates. Apart from electric scooters, bicycle rental points are also available. Bicycles are rented on an hourly basis.

Foreign nationals who plan to reside in Türkiye for more than a year are required to have health insurance. Foreign guests who do not hold Turkish citizenship must apply for health insurance to obtain a residence permit. Under insurance coverage, foreign nationals can access guarantees such as outpatient and inpatient medical treatments.

According to current prices, the monthly rent for a one-bedroom apartment ranges from approximately 3500 to 8000 TL. You may need to pay a deposit when you rent an apartment for the first time. Additionally, you will need to pay fees for natural gas, electricity, and water subscriptions. Natural gas and electricity bills operate on a billing system, while water subscription uses a prepaid card system.

Based on current prices, single rooms in shared apartments range from 4500 to 7000 TL, while double rooms are between 3000 and 5000 TL. You might also prefer a single-suite apartment with a bathroom and kitchen. Monthly rental fees for suite apartments average around 7000 to 10000 TL.

There are state dormitories affiliated with the General Directorate of Higher Education Credit and Hostels. Dormitories are located in various parts of the city. The advantage of the girls' dormitory on the Anadolu University Yunus Emre Campus is that it is usually cheaper than apartments and includes meals. Current dormitory prices range from 450 to 800 TL. Deposit fees vary between 683 and 900 TL depending on the dormitory type.
